



THE PRIVATE SECURITY SECTOR PROVIDENT FUND (PSSPF) ENGAGES INDUSTRY STAKEHOLDERS



From 13 May 2016 – The Private Security Sector Provident

Fund (PSSPF) will be launching its yearly Compliance Drive campaigns that are aimed at attaining sector wide compliance for the betterment of all private security employers, security services consumers and security employees including their families.

The PSSPF will kick-start its campaigns by hosting its 2nd Annual Stakeholder Golf Day with the sole purpose of fostering better relations with key stakeholders of the Private Security Industry. The envisaged outcome is to enable the stakeholders to better understand the Fund and its purpose. This is also to promote a wider circle of responsibility for decisions and actions in order to curb the rampant non-compliance by some employers.

The Dignitaries in attendance will include the Minister of Police, the representatives of the Private Industry Regulatory Authority (PSIRA), Employer Organisations, Labour Federations, Private Security Employers and the Consumers of Private Security Services.

According to Robert Dube, the PSSPF Board Chairperson, the PSSPF Board of Trustees remain steadfast in fulfilling its fiduciary duties of overseeing the overall activities of the Fund and ensure that

members are provided with benefits when they retire, terminate employment by resigning, or on retrenchment or otherwise, or pass on before retirement.

“This is the reason interacting with other key stakeholders in the sector such as the Employers and Consumers of Security Services is essential and remains the one of key objectives of the PSSPF to communicate and educate on issues of compliance,” he said.

From 01 June to 21 August 2016 - The PSSPF will be commencing with its Stakeholder Information Sharing Session which is also a national outreach campaign. This campaign strives to engage stakeholders on the Fund’s adopted operational turnaround plan that is improving efficiency in rendering services to its stakeholders. The latter is aimed at reinforcing the PSSPF’s vision of being a sustainable value benefit creator in the private

security sector.

In addition, the Trustees will be reporting back to stakeholders on the work attained by the outgoing Board and outline the process on the appointment of the new Board of Trustees.

The stakeholders will also have an opportunity to interact with PSIRA and the Department of Labour on the industry requirements and the current activities embarked on by the latter institutions.

The PSSPF encourages ALL Private Security Employers and the Consumers of Security Services to attend these sessions in large numbers as they serve to empower them with information that will be of value for their businesses.
